The 3rd International Conference on Public Health 2017 was organized by The International Institute of Knowledge Management (TIIKM), Sri Lanka with the collaboration of Taylor's University and MAHSA University Malaysia as Co- Hosting Partners. Sikkim Manipal Institute of Medical Sciences, India, Faculty of Medical Sciences – University of Sri Jayewardenepura, Sri Lanka, Monash University, Malaysia and International Institute of Health Management and Research, India graced the conference as academic partners. .

The conference was held on 27th – 29th of July 2017, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. ICOPH 2017 was organized under the theme **"Strengthening the Public Health Infrastructure towards Health Communities"**. 


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
